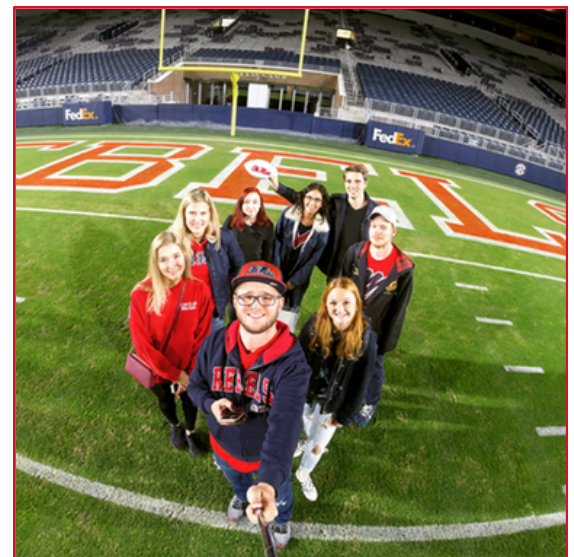

For on-campus housing, students will apply through the [student housing portal](#). They will be notified of the housing application after they have been admitted.

Students applying for off-campus housing must make their own arrangements.





ACADEMICS

Most departments and classes are open to exchange students. Visit olemiss.edu/academics to view all major programs at UM.

Some specialized programs are restricted, such as Education, Pharmacy, School of Law (graduate-level, not the Legal Studies Department), School of Medicine, and BFA programs that require portfolios to be admitted (Film Production, Studio Art, Acting).

ACADEMIC STRENGTHS

Some of our university's best programs are our Honors College, International Studies, Journalism and New Media, Public Policy Leadership, Intensive English Program, Business, Computer Science, English Literature, Creative Writing, Economics, Education, Engineering, Environmental Studies, Music, Political Science, and Biological Sciences programs.

MINIMUM COURSE REQUIREMENTS (FULL-TIME)

12 credits, generally 4 courses per semester for undergraduates
9 credits, generally 3 courses per semester for graduates

The full-time Intensive English program is 18 credits per semester.

COURSE SELECTION

Visit our student portal website [here](#).

Select "Course Schedule" on the right side of the screen under "Academics" and then search by term. If the course schedule has not yet been released, search for courses in the previous YEAR (not semester).

For example: A student wants to find courses for Fall 2025, but the schedule has not been released yet. Instead, the student should search for courses in Fall 2024.

Intensive English courses are offered at no extra charge to exchange students. Exchange and fee-paying study abroad students can take as few or as many Intensive English courses as desired.

All courses except for foreign language courses will be taught in English.



STUDENT SERVICES AND PROGRAMS

Airport Shuttles

Our office provides airport shuttles for arrival and departure days at the Memphis International Airport (MEM). Shuttles are scheduled according to students' flight information.

Welcome Week

We provide a wide variety of welcome week activities for students to get connected to campus before the start of their semester. Activities include campus tours, welcome dinners, grocery trips, and meeting students' Global Ambassador mentors.

Global Ambassadors Mentor Program

Global Ambassadors are our American or degree-seeking student mentors who are here to help students adjust to campus life and meet new friends. All visiting/exchange and IEP students are automatically paired with a Global Ambassador.

Semester Events

We host a variety of cultural activities throughout the semester. Examples include sports events, holiday parties, and our end of the semester farewell dinner.

Our office also hosts excursions to nearby cities at least once each semester. Examples include trips to New Orleans, LA; Nashville, TN; Atlanta, GA; and Chicago, IL.
